Disaster resilience is a collective effort

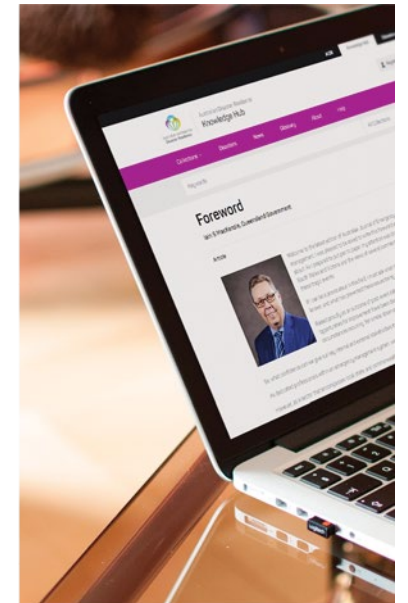

People outlast programs

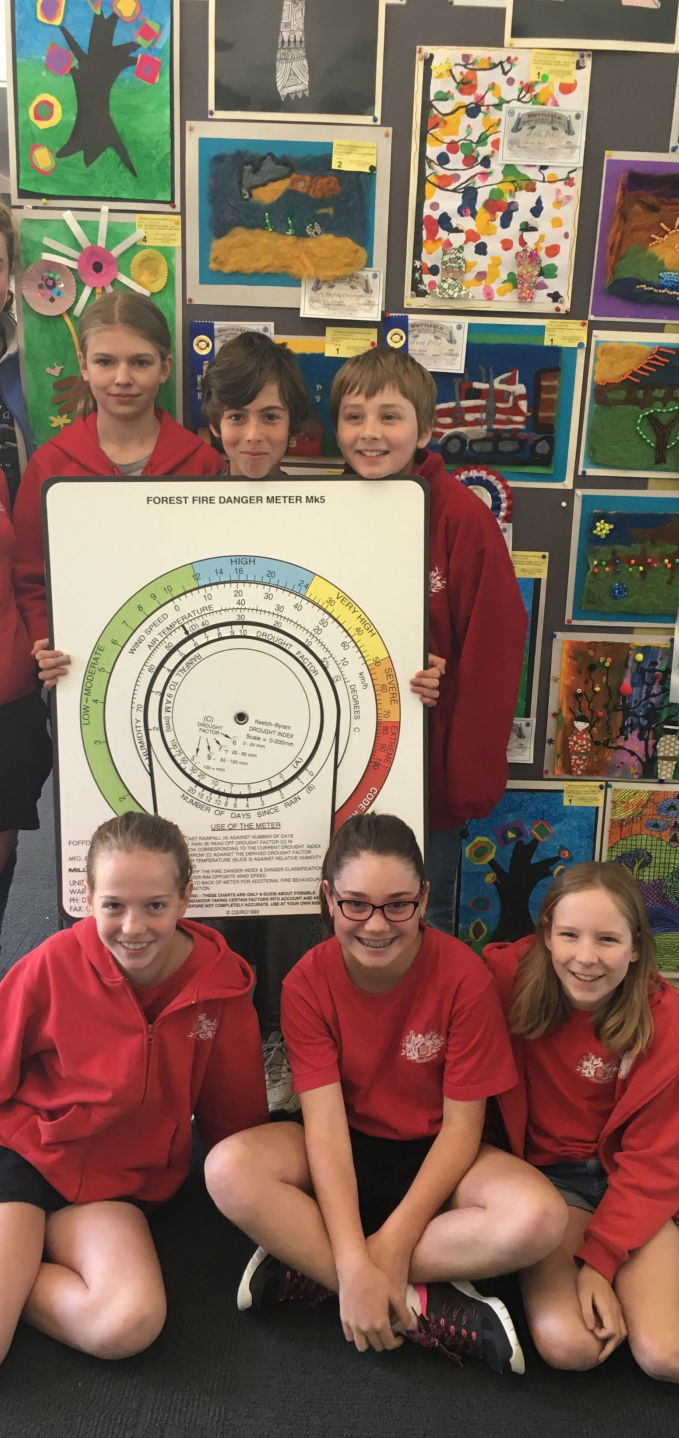
People will carry on the journey of building resilience in communities – **networks** are key.
