### **Answers:**

- (B) False. Driving into water is like driving into a wall if you go faster. The best thing to do is not drive into flood water at all.
- 2. (A) True. Water is very heavy. Each cubic metre of water is about 1,000 kilograms, so it can knock you over.

FUN FACT: 15cm of flood water can actually move a one-tonne car, 60cm can float it away, and even a four-wheel-drive can be floated away in 80cm of water.

- 3. (A) True. It prevents backflow from the sewerage system coming up.
- TIP: You can also use a brick wrapped in a towel.

- 4. (B) False. It is actually impossible to open the door.
- 5. (A) True. Snakes and spiders are some examples.

FUN FACT: During a flood in Brisbane, bull sharks were deposited into a golf club lake, and they are still there!

- 6. (B) False. You should contact the Australian Red Cross, which manages Register. Find. Reunite. a service that connects people affected by disasters with their loved ones.
- TIP: Register.Find.Reunite. is launched during disasters. It can be accessed by going to the Australian Red Cross website, phoning 1800 100 188, or visiting an evacuation centre.

### **Answers:**

- (B) False. Thunder is a direct result of lightning.
   However, it is possible you might see lightning and not hear the thunder because it is too far away.
- 2. (B) False. It usually strikes the tallest object, but not always.
- 3. (A) True.
- 4. (B) False. A lightning current can branch off from a tree to a person, or other objects like fence posts. You are not safe under a tree.
- 5. (A) True. You do not want to use corded phones, or anything that is connected to electricity. So you can use your mobile phone, just not while it is charging.
- 6. (B) False. If you lie down flat you will increase your chances of being affected.
- TIP: The safest position is squatting on the balls of your feet, with your head tucked down. Cover your ears with your hands.
- 7. (B) False. You can't get electrocuted by touching them.
- TIP: You should call triple-zero (000) and start CPR immediately.
- 8. (B) False. The insulation value of rubber is only about 5,000 volts. A lightning strike on average is 100,000 volts.
- 9. (A) True. Clouds that have a strong updraft keep lifting water droplets to the top, and it makes it more likely that they will freeze.
- 10. (B) False. (unless your bathroom is correctly earthed). It is best not to bathe, shower or wash the dishes during a storm.
