Modern day crisis events are transboundary reflecting tight coupling of societal systems. Complex, modern crises exceed the brief of emergency services.

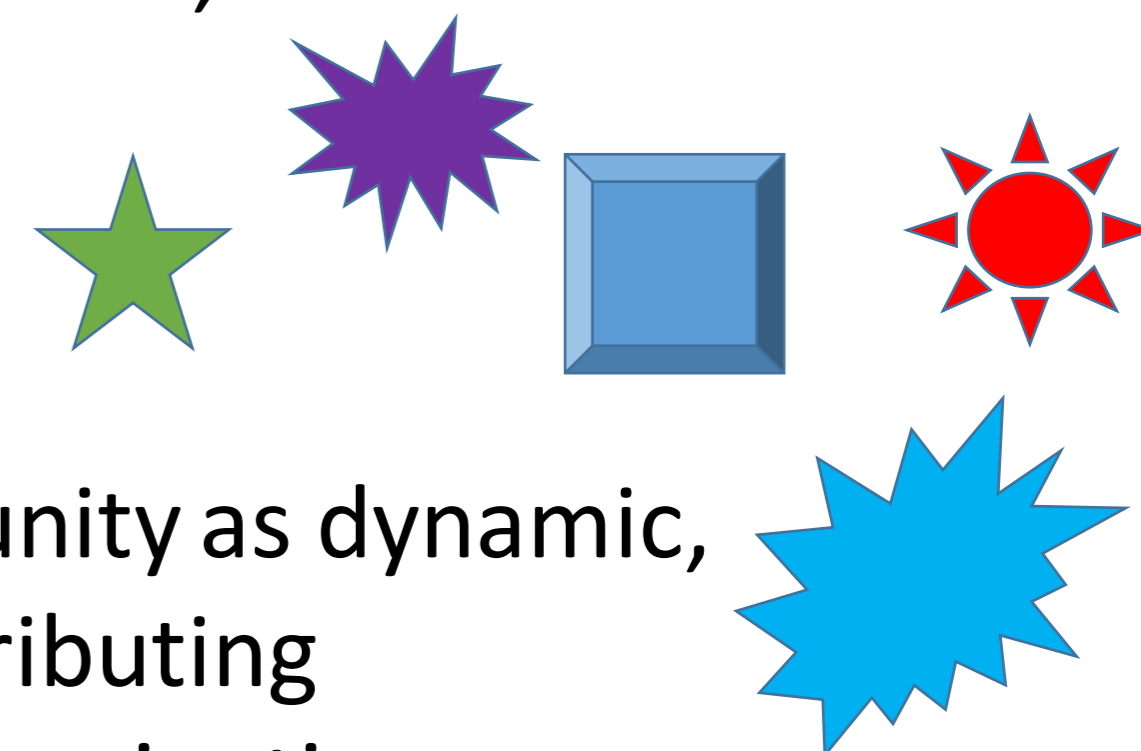
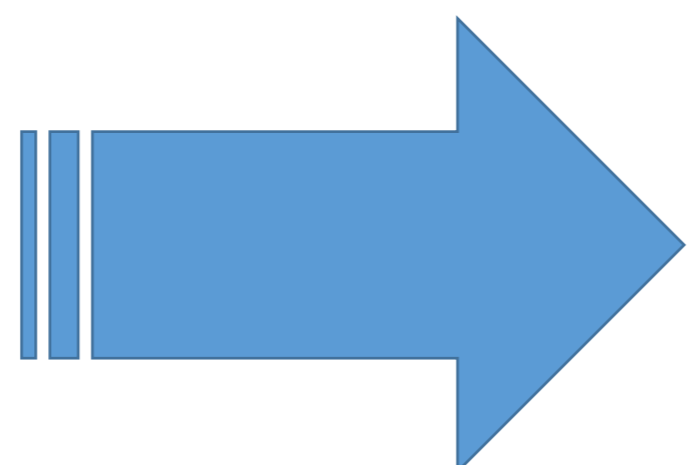
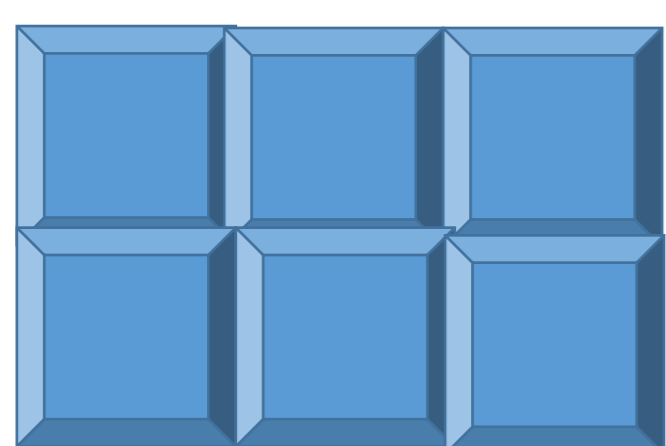
Novelty is a shared feature of 21st century crises. Communities have limited knowledge and less control over crisis events or the nature of assistance they receive toward recovery.



Communities affected by disasters can be marginalized and not recognized in their diversity or placed as less important than the interests of corporations or developers. CLP is then severely limited. Three early 21st century disasters show how neglected communities can be.
